Projects include artwork based in the following art history movements:

- Impressionism
- Post impressionism: Fathers of Modern Art
- Cubism
- Expressionism
- Pop Art
- Photorealism
- Performance Art

Portfolio Audition /Teacher character recommendation

Fees and art kit/art supplies required.

PHOTOGRAPHY (8th/9th)

The students will use photo media to explore their visual world. Projects include:

- Create a pinhole camera
- Develop a photograph
- Landscape photography
- Portrait photography
- Still - life photography
- Abstract photography



Your student will develop these skills:

Knowledge of how a camera works

Excellent composition

Exposure adjustment

Getting "sharp" photos

Using depth of field

Applying elements and principles of design to photography

Photo class fee required.

Access to digital camera strongly recommended.

ART FOUNDATIONS I (ART 7)

Art Foundations I is a beginning level art class where the basic elements of art are taught. Included with these are:

- ◆ Color theory and the color wheel
- ◆ Value
- ◆ Reductive value methods
- ◆ Blind contour line
- ◆ Perspective and optical illusion
- ◆ Watercolor techniques: Washes, wet into wet, glazing



2D DESIGN (ART 8)

2D Design focuses on designing a composition using the elements and principles of art. The projects include concepts and media in the following areas:

- Creating emphasis or focal point
- Balance
- Creating movements in an abstraction
- Collage - Creating a meaning for a current issue
- Abstraction - Finding abstract compositions, levels of abstraction, print making
- Surrealism on scratch board

ART FOUNDATIONS II (ART 9)

Foundations II is an intermediate art class that builds on the elements and principles of design to create artworks. Projects include the following:

- ◆ Ink wash still life
- ◆ Collage as sketch and watercolor of collage
- ◆ Portraiture
- ◆ Caricature
- ◆ Figure drawing
- ◆ Cubism
- ◆ Illustration
- ◆ Interpretation of opposite concepts



Art develops these skills:

- ◆ Observation
- ◆ Visual problem solving
- ◆ Critique skills
- ◆ Technique in a variety of media
- ◆ Interpretation of media
- ◆ Creative exploration
- ◆ Ability to create meaning

CERAMICS I

Students will accomplish a greater understanding of clay, its properties, and how to use it to create form. Projects include:

- ◆ Decorative coil pot
- ◆ Slab mugs
- ◆ Bowl set
- ◆ Wheel thrown creation
- ◆ From inspired by lyrics
- ◆ Organic abstraction
- ◆ Cultural mask

Your student will learn the manipulation of clay, a variety of clay techniques and building methods.
